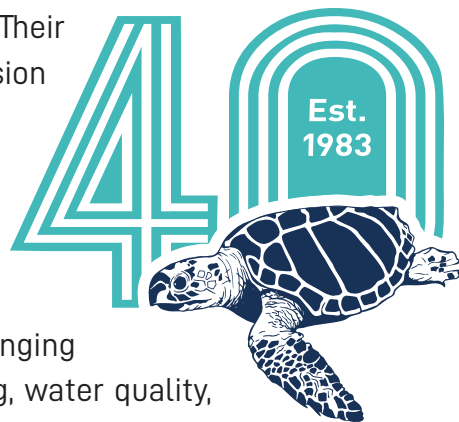

# Education is in Loggerhead Marineline Center's DNA

Founder Eleanor Fletcher taught children about threatened sea turtles. Forty years after Eleanor's first "lesson" in a small wading pool, the Center continues to build on her legacy.

Today, the Center offers more than 25 education programs, ranging from Hatchling Tales for pre-schoolers, STEM summer camps for kids, Fishing Clinics and Guided Night Turtle Walks to observe species on Earth for more than 40 million years. More than 75,000 learners of all ages participate in LMC programming annually.

Oceans of Opportunity, LMC's flagship diversity, equity, inclusion, and accessibility initiative, states that no child should be denied the opportunity to see the ocean and "meet" South Florida's marine life. Consequently, the LMC Board continues its long-standing commitment to a free admission policy.

Oceans of Opportunity also provides free ocean literacy resources to classrooms, teacher trainings, and scholarships for students attending Title 1 schools to experience a field trip to LMC, and out-of-school time programs in schools and community resource centers.

In 2022, LMC was chosen as an expanded learning opportunity provider by Prime Time Palm Beach County which receives significant funding from the Children's Services Council of Palm Beach County. LMC created "Diving into Ocean Connections," a six-week afterschool and summer program. Children can explore Florida's marine biodiversity through interactive lessons and games and experience a range of roles, from donning veterinarian scrubs to digitally diving on Florida's Coral Reef. In 2022, LMC offered over 2,500 learning experiences that impacted more than 1,600 youth in out-of-school time programs.

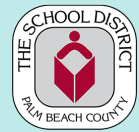
"Our new exhibits and education spaces provide a powerful medium through which we educate visitors about critical coastal ecosystems," says Hannah Campbell, Vice President of Education.

# LMC's Hospital returns rehabilitated patients to their ocean homes

For nearly 40 years, LMC's rehabilitation team has provided expert veterinary care to sick and injured sea turtles.

LMC's advanced hospital, founded by the Gordon & Patricia Gray family, is a leading facility in Florida. The hospital staff administers various innovative therapies throughout the rescue-to-release process. Sea turtle patients are released as soon as they are medically cleared. Our hospital staff has pioneered novel life-saving therapies that are now used throughout the world where sea turtles are treated.

In 2022, the newly re-opened FPL Outdoor Hospital saw the addition of 18 more rehabilitation tanks and an ICU section that isolates critically ill patients, bringing us to a total of 26 turtle rehab tanks.

2022 was a transition year for the rehabilitation staff. Long-time veterinarian Dr. Charlie Manire retired, and the Center hired Dr. Heather Barron, as Chief Science Officer and head veterinarian, overseeing conservation, research, and rehabilitation functions.

Dr. Barron is a licensed wildlife and sea turtle rehabilitator with more than 25 years experience practicing and teaching wildlife medicine. She came to LMC from CROW (Clinic for the Rehabilitation of Wildlife) where she was lead veterinarian.

In announcing Dr. Barron's arrival CEO Andy Dehart said, "Having someone of Dr. Barron's caliber join us is a testament to the rich history of LMC. It shows the exciting future that we all see for the facility."

Dr. Barron is no stranger to the Center. She has collaborated for many years with LMC — in the care of sea turtles and on seminal research projects that have significantly impacted sea turtle health. She is author of more than 120 scientific publications, continues to research and write, and is an in-

ternationally acclaimed speaker who provides consultation to veterinarians across the globe.

In the short time she's been on staff, she has assembled an accomplished hospital team and played an instrumental role in getting LMC's rehabilitation sea turtle permits reinstated by FWC. In conjunction with LMC, she also pio-neered a treatment for brevetoxicosis (red tide poisoning) that appears to be safe and effective in sea turtles and many other marine species.

# LMC's Research Department maintains robust and useful nesting data

LMC's Research Department has one of the longest running sea turtle monitoring programs in Florida, providing a wealth of insight and information to researchers, policymakers, and environmental scientists. LMC founder, Eleanor Fletcher, launched the research program when she received her permit from the state in 1969.

Each season, the LMC researchers document all sea turtle activities from March 1 to October 31 along 9.5 miles of beach from the northern Palm Beach County line south to John D. MacArthur Beach State Park. While most folks are sleeping, the morning team records crawls and nests; the night team gathers data while the females are nesting in a trance-like state. "The work requires dedication and focus," says Sarah Hirsch, who oversees aspects of the morning and night-time monitoring programs. "We have yet to top our busiest night, July 1, 2020, when we recorded 282 nests and 1,311 false crawls".

LMC tags and tracks nesting female sea turtles. "Since we started in 2001, we have tagged 2,100 turtles including a leatherback named Juno. We've spotted her 34 times since 2001 and she is expected back in 2023," says Dr. Perrault, Director of Research.

In the last 30 years, LMC researchers have recorded over 770,000 sea turtle activities (nesting and false crawls). "We have monitored and protected over 4,600 leatherback nests, 269,000 loggerhead nests, and 55,000 green turtle nests," says Dr. Perrault. What is the impact of that protection?

Dr. Perrault estimates that these nests produced over 20 million hatchlings.

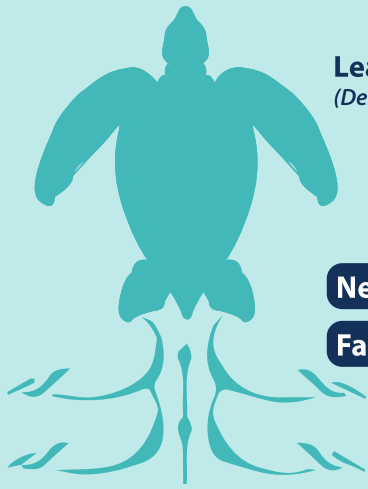
The Department contributes regularly to the scientific literature on sea turtles. It has published over 70 manuscripts, books, and book chapters on a vast range of topics relating to toxicology, health, rehabilitation, climate change, sea turtle movement patterns, beach armoring, injury prevalence, anatomical anomalies, and general sea turtle population trends. The Department collaborates with more than 50 institutions.

# Ocean debris is a key threat to sea turtles

An estimated eight million metric tons of plastic enter the ocean every year. The Center's Conservation Team develops and implements comprehensive conservation solutions to man-made threats facing sea turtles, from plastic to fishing debris. We work with more than 90 partners and stakeholders all over the world to establish global sea turtle conservation initiatives backed by in-house data.

A good example is LMC's Project SHIELD. It originated in 2013 when LMC staff partnered with other sea turtle organizations to rescue and rehabilitate turtles accidentally hooked on fishing piers. The result is an education program that provides conservation solutions to fishing piers, recreational boaters, beach-side hotels, snorkel and SCUBA operators, fishing charter operators, and beach access points as well as pollution prevention projects.

Raising awareness of plastic pollution's impact on sea turtle health is a key conservation team priority. In 2022, with support from Bank of America and other generous funders, LMC held "Tour de Trash" — 12 large-scale public beach cleanups throughout South Florida. Over 700 participants helped remove and sort 2,021 lbs. of marine debris at our Mobile Marine Debris Sorting Station. Strong media coverage amplified our conservation message and generated advocacy for sensitive turtle nesting habitats.

LMC assists with regular underwater cleanups at partnering fishing piers to remove derelict fishing gear that poses entanglement risks to marine life. LMC is the local coordinator for FWC's Mono-filament Recovery and Recycling Program (MRRP) that encourages the proper disposal of used fishing line and gear. LMC, in partnership with Sea Turtle Adventures, monitors 65 monofilament recycling bins in locations throughout Palm Beach County.

Cigarette litter is found on beaches worldwide. Each filter contains thousands of microplastic fragments called cellulose acetate. Through funding awarded by Keep America Beautiful and the Florida Department of Environmental Protection, LMC installs and maintains cigarette litter receptacles throughout Palm Beach County and provides receptacles to Responsible Pier Initiative partners across the US.

In 2022, LMC worked with the City of West Palm Beach to conduct "before" and "after" scans to gauge cigarette litter program effectiveness. Over 10,738 pieces of cigarette litter were collected.

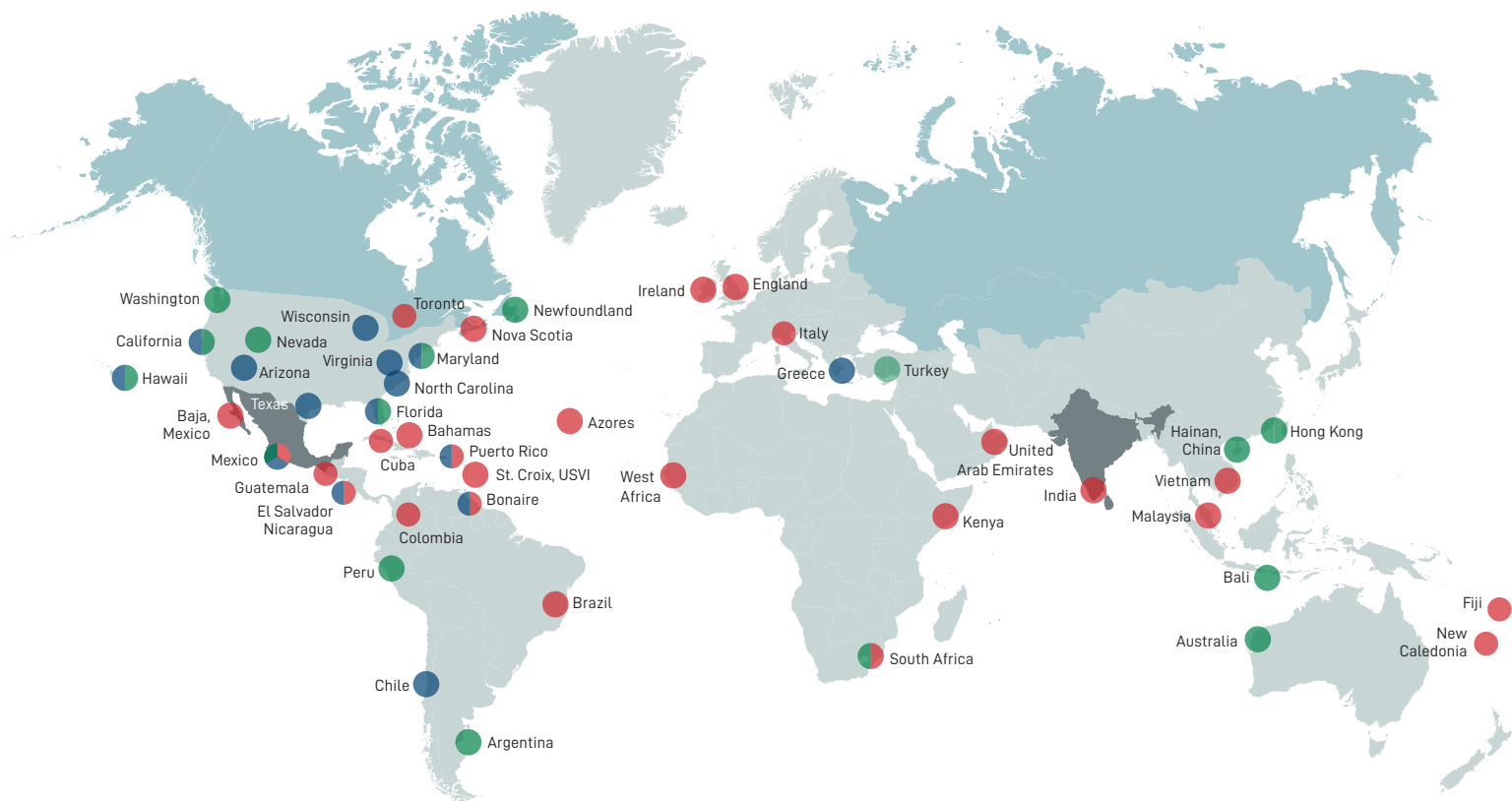

# LMC manages the iconic Juno Beach Pier

The Juno Beach Pier is a bucket list attraction for Palm Beach County tourists and a daily destination for many residents. The LMC Guest Services Team ensures repeat visits.

In 2022, LMC completed the Juno Beach Pier House renovations. The new pier house features a snack bar with expanded menu options and a store stocked with a variety of fishing tackle, including rental poles and bait. LMC partnered with Surflife to install multiple HD cameras, allowing visitors a bird's-eye view of the surf and fishing conditions along the 990-foot-long pier.

LMC holds Kid's Fishing Clinics at the pier, teaching young anglers how to catch and release and fish responsibly.

The Juno Beach Pier is the flagship location for LMC's Responsible Pier Initiative (RPI). The RPI team works with 74 partner fishing piers in five states and Puerto Rico to provide first responders with the resources and training to effectively rescue unintentionally hooked or entangled sea turtles or sea birds.

RPI provides educational workshops, signage, rescue nets, pollution prevention measures, and more to protect marine life. Since the program's launch in 2013, there have been 1,053 reported sea turtle interactions with 822 successful rescues at the piers participating in the RPI.

# Stingrays, jellies, seahorses, snappers, and pufferfish delight campus visitors

We're Loggerhead Marinelife Center and we're known for treating and releasing sea turtles. We also offer guests a chance to get to know many of the species that call South Florida's marine ecosystem home. LMC opened three outdoor Florida Ecosystem Exhibits and several new exhibits in One Ocean Hall in the summer 2022.

Eager visitors are awed by the reef fish in the Gulf Stream habitat, calmed by the floating jellies in One Ocean Hall, and tickled by the antics of a porcupine pufferfish who cavorts in the Coral Reef habitat.

LMC's dedicated Animal Care Team works around the clock to ensure that our sea turtle patients and aquarium residents receive top-notch care. "There's a lot to know and do every day," says Curt Slocum, Animal Care Curator. "From ensuring that the exhibits are clean, to making sure that none of our animals miss a meal."

Senior Aquarist Mark Delves says, "We love our jobs and the awesome responsibilities that come with them. After all, these incredibly diverse animals serve as ambassadors for their species and our native ecosystems."

## The life support systems (LSS) Department is LMC's "Special Ops" Team



State-of-the-art LSS system ensures water quality

When the expanded campus was on the drawing board, the veterinary team asked for a new "closed loop" life support system that would shield sea turtle patients from environmental threats such as oil spills, hurricanes, or red tide. The addition of new ICU hospital tanks and marine life exhibits also required a more sophisticated aquatic life support system. Thanks to the generosity of the Glenn W.

& Cornelia T. Bailey Foundation, the Center has an efficient state-of-the-art system.

In 2022, we assembled a team of water quality experts all of which have had years of experience in some of the top notch science centers, aquariums, and aquaculture facilities in the United States. "Our Life Support Systems Team maintains and monitors the Center's water quality and system parameters to ensure the health of all sea turtle patients and aquarium residents," notes Xavier Cortesano, COO. "These are truly knowledgeable technicians who can trouble-shoot any issues immediately."

They oversee the system operation and water quality, the electrical wiring, pumps and sensors, ozone generators, and automation systems. We're lucky to have them on board."



# The expanded Center requires a more skilled Operations Team

In building the new wing, the Center expanded its footprint by 129%. As such, the duties of the Operations Team grew exponentially. "We geared up to manage and support the various additions to the building and its IT infrastructure by adding staff with expertise in new key areas," says COO, Xavier Cortesano. "Adding aquaria, state-of-the-art closed-loop aquatic life support systems, turtle safe LED lighting, and a 100-seat auditorium meant introducing automated building systems to provide for more efficient daily operations.

We needed to ensure that the new marine habitats, digital interactive exhibits and education and event spaces could function smoothly throughout the day and provide visitors with seamless enjoyable visits."

"When I arrived at LMC, I knew that a person like Xavier would get us operationally up to speed quickly," says Andy Dehart, CEO. "He's not only a superb COO, but he also has a great eye for exhibit design, guest flow, and enhancing

the visitor experience. He brings a fresh perspective as he tackles the challenges of operating a new campus that has not only doubled in size, but requires a more robust facility management approach. He understands finance and is creative in finding new ways to reduce operating costs while maximizing the output from the various departments that keep LMC operating smoothly."

The Operations Team welcomes daily feedback from guests and colleagues, recognizing them as an opportunity to fine tune the varied aspects of being a guest at the Center. "Whether it is wayfinding to ensure that no experience is missed, managing active third graders as they go from classrooms to the Outdoor Hospital on a field trip, or providing volunteers with adequate protection and relief from the harsh summer sun with the installation of shade sails and fans, we work endlessly to support all departments," says Cortesano. "In a new facility, each day can bring a different challenge and I'm proud our team tackles each one with a 'can-do' attitude."

# The Center's expansion creates a sought-after event space in Palm Beach County

When the Center more than doubled its footprint during its recent expansion, generous donors made possible four multipurpose rooms, an auditorium, and two decks with stunning views of the Atlantic Ocean. The multipurpose rooms are often packed with young learners engaged in classes and camps that get them excited about ocean conservation.

For evening events, those rooms can open to host up to 300 guests who have access to the Oceanview Sky Deck. "They may be celebrating a wedding, birthday, anniversary, or holding a corporate dinner," says Tonya Pellegrini, Events Manager. "The common thread in these events is a breath-taking view of the Atlantic Ocean in a place that celebrates our local marine life."

Since the space opened in March 2022, Pellegrini and team have booked 55 events with a tour-to-booking success rate of 92%. Bookings included 17 non-profit events, 14 corporate events, nine weddings, and eight internal events. "We are seeing bookings well into 2024, which means that people are hungry to celebrate important life events in our unique space."

Couples want a space that's meaningful, says Pellegrini.

Run 4 The Sea, a four-mile run along the ocean, connects human health to the health of the ocean. More than 500 elite runners, joggers, walkers, and children participate each year.

Florida's preeminent ocean conservation awards event, the Go Blue Awards recognizes individuals and businesses that promote the conservation of ocean ecosystems with a special focus on threatened and endangered sea turtles.



## Hike20 Challenge

This three-day, two-night backcountry fundraising event supports Oceans of Opportunity. Participants hike through iconic ecosystems of South Florida with trail experts from the Loxahatchee Chapter of the Florida Trail Association and LMC education staff.

the Circle doubled and provided more than \$30 million to the Center — to expand our campus, find novel treatments to dramatically reduce patient deaths, and create partnerships with groups across the globe to protect sea turtles.

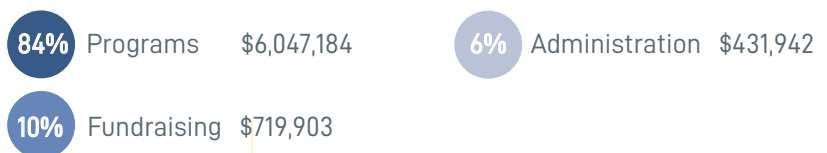
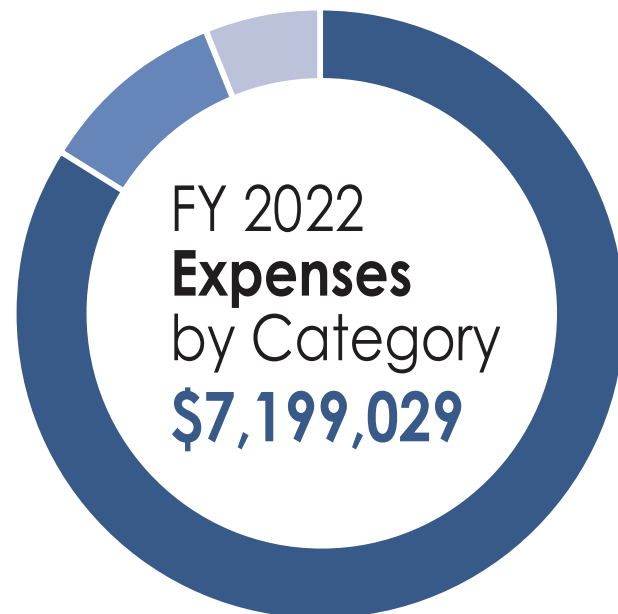
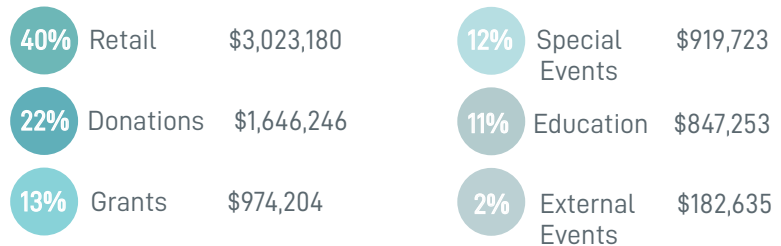
# LMC is in sound financial health.

## Financial Snapshot Fiscal Year January – December 2022

In 2022, LMC achieved a strong financial year driven by consistent gains in our retail shop and donor contributions. Grant funding and the unwavering commitment from our environmental sector colleagues and local community organizations continued to support our mission and work throughout the year. We also saw considerable revenue gains from program offerings and special-event activities.

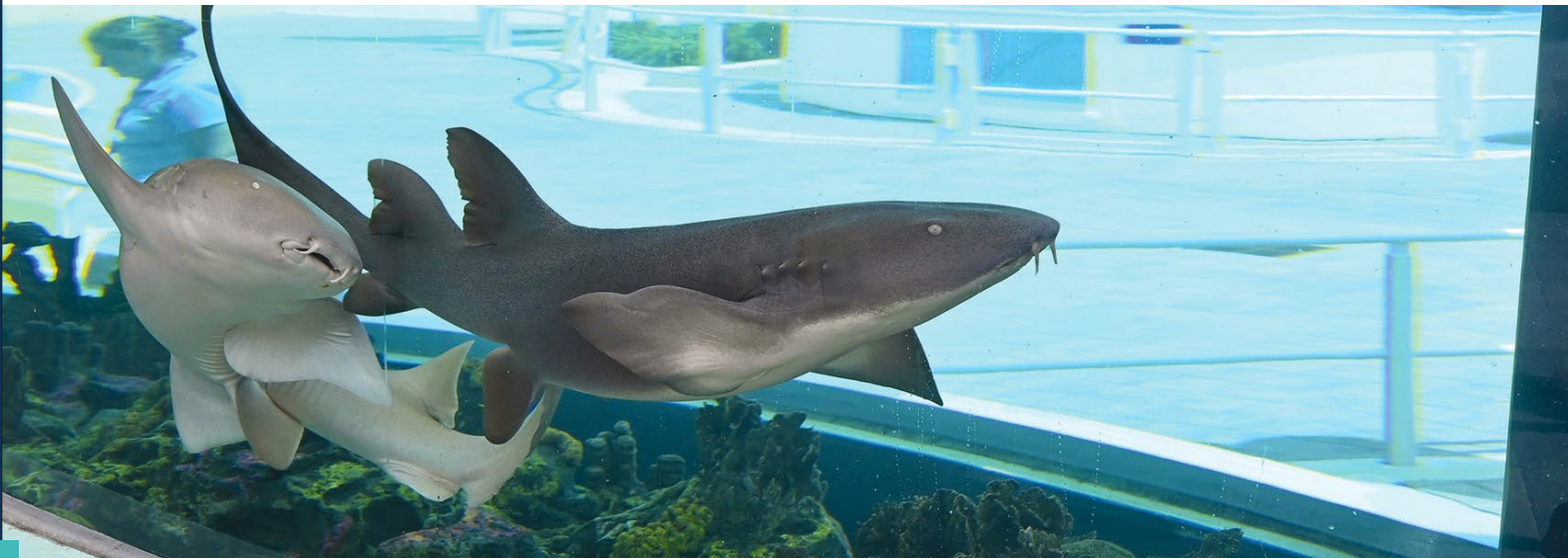
