During the month of May, local volunteers participated in beach cleanups in Juno Beach, Florida. Following each beach and underwater cleanup, LMC's Conservation Department sorts and analyzes 25% of the debris collected. The debris removed during the cleanup was sorted and data collected in alignment with best practices as outlined by our partners at NOAA and the Ocean Conservancy.

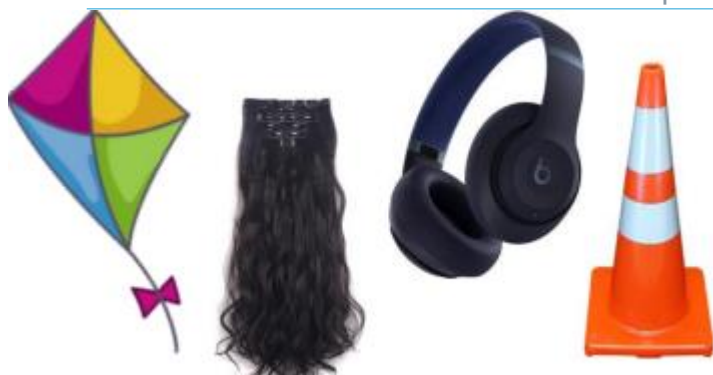


Figure 1. Unusual items found during beach clean-ups; a kite, hair extensions, beats headphones, and a traffic cone.

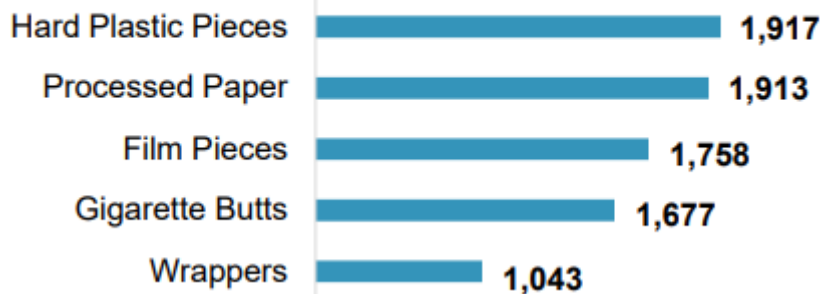


Figure 2. Top 5 items collected in May 2024.

Remove all items. Including Trash! Debris items can entangle and block turtles on their way to the ocean.

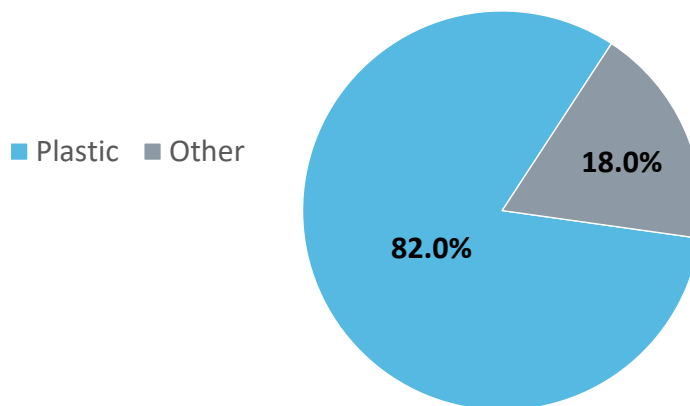


Figure 3. 82.0% of all debris removed was plastic.
